- Funding application must be submitted 1 month in advance of the end of regular registration to allow for adequate review time for the committee and scheduling of the activity by the trainee.
- Before completion of the application, the resident/fellow should contact Drs. Turner-Lawrence or Adams to ensure this is an appropriate application.

- Applications should include the resident/fellow's CV, a completed application (see below), and an estimated budget of funding.
